

The Gunpowder Plot



In **1605**, a group of men, including **Guy Fawkes**, planned to **blow up the Houses of Parliament**. They wanted to remove **King James I** and replace him with a Catholic ruler. Today, people in Britain remember the event on **Bonfire Night (5th November)** by lighting fireworks and burning an effigy of Guy Fawkes on a bonfire.



Key Information

The Tudors ruled England for 118 years – The Tudor period lasted from 1485 to 1603, starting with Henry VII and ending with Elizabeth I.

Henry VIII had six wives – He married multiple times to have a male heir, but only one son, Edward VI, survived childhood.

The Church of England was created – Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic Church and made himself the head of the Church of England.

Elizabeth I defeated the Spanish Armada in 1588 – This was a famous battle at sea where England stopped Spain from invading.

The Gunpowder Plot happened in 1605 – A group of people, including Guy Fawkes, tried to blow up Parliament but were caught.
